# MARK 6:30-44 (NRSVUE)

The apostles gathered around Jesus and told him all that they had done and taught. He said to them, "Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while." For many were coming and going, and they had no leisure even to eat. And they went away in the boat to a deserted place by themselves. Now many saw them going and recognized them, and they hurried there on foot from all the towns and arrived ahead of them. As he went ashore, he saw a great crowd, and he had compassion for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd, and he began to teach them many things. When it grew late, his disciples came to him and said, "This is a deserted place, and the hour is now very late; send them away so that they may go into the surrounding country and villages and buy something for themselves to eat." But he answered them, "You give them something to eat." They said to him, "Are we to go and buy two hundred denarii worth of bread and give it to them to eat?" And he said to them, "How many loaves have you? Go and see." When they had found out, they said, "Five, and two fish." Then he ordered them to get all the people to sit down in groups on the green grass. So they sat down in groups of hundreds and of fifties. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven and blessed and broke the loaves and gave them to his disciples to set before the people, and he divided the two fish among them all. And all ate and were filled, and they took up twelve baskets full of broken pieces and of the fish. Those who had eaten the loaves numbered five thousand men.

Next Wednesday, June 19, is Juneteenth, the day commemorating when the announcement of emancipation of enslaved peoples finally reached Galveston, Texas. This was in 1865, 2 ½ years after the Emancipation Proclamation was signed into law on January 1, 1863. Until recently, Juneteenth was celebrated primarily by folks within Black communities. The Black Lives Matter movement has drawn increasing attention to Juneteenth and President Biden declared it the newest national holiday last year. However, even though Juneteenth observances have gained popularity, there is much work to do to honor the spirit of the holiday, which calls all of us to work together to end police brutality and mass incarceration, provide for equitable wages and education for people of color, and end all forms of oppression. Let us dedicate ourselves, all of us, to the work of antiracism, work that we know is never done, but that is an ongoing journey for us all.
